A Few Facts about Poinsettias (From Pam Shields):

This is the time of year when you see poinsettias for sale nearly everywhere you go. Most of us can't resist buying these plants because they brighten our homes for the December holidays. Did you know:

- The plant's name is pronounced in four syllables: *Poin-set-ee-uh*.
- That it is commonly known as the Christmas Star. It's association with Christmas comes
 from a Mexican legend, in which a child, with no means to bring a gift, gathered humble
 weeds to place at the church alter on Christmas Eve. As the congregation looked on, a
 miracle occurred and the weeds turned into brilliant red and green flowers.
- The plant (euphorbia pulcherrima) is named after Joel Roberts Poinsett, first US ambassador to Mexico. He was an amateur botanist and introduced the plant to the US in 1825.
- The red leaves are called bracts, and are not flowers. The actual flower in the center is yellow.
- Contrary to popular belief, poinsettias are not poisonous.
- Although poinsettias are grown commercially in nearly every state, California leads with over 6 million pots grown annually, followed by North Carolina and Texas.

Don't put your full trust in Caller ID on your phone:

Your caller ID could be wrong. Concerned residents have reported they've gotten phone calls from a Virginia Beach Police Department (VBPD) sergeant demanding payment to avoid jail. These calls are from scammers impersonating law enforcement and using a real officer's name.

But your voicemail is never wrong; let any call you don't recognize flow to voicemail in order to review and screen.

Social media:

Stay private – regularly update privacy settings for social media sites. Scammers will often troll for personal information on Facebook, Twitter and other commonly used sites to make their stories more believable

History Corner:

December 1, 1955 - The birth of the modern American civil rights movement occurred as Rosa Parks was arrested in Montgomery, Alabama.

December 2, 1823 - President James Monroe introduced his "Monroe Doctrine" prohibiting any further colonization of the American continents by European powers.

December 2, 1942 - Physicists led by Enrico Fermi carried out the world's first successful nuclear chain reaction at the University of Chicago.

December 2, 1982 - The first permanent artificial heart was implanted in 61-year-old Barney C. Clark by Dr. William De Vries at the University of Utah Medical Center.

December 7, 1787 - Delaware became the first state to adopt the new constitution of the United States of America.

December 7, 1941 - The U.S. Naval base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, was <u>attacked</u> by nearly 200 Japanese aircraft in a raid that left nearly 3,000 Americans dead.

December 15, 1791 - The <u>Bill of Rights</u> (first 10 amendments to the U.S. Constitution) became effective following ratification by Virginia.

December 16, 1773 - The <u>Boston Tea Party</u> occurred as colonial activists boarded British ships anchored in Boston and dumped 342 containers of tea into the water.

December 16, 1944 - During World War II in Europe, the <u>Battle of the Bulge</u> began as the Germans launched a big counter-offensive in the Ardennes Forest.

December 20, 1606 - The Virginia Company expedition to America began as three small ships, the *Susan Constant, Godspeed* and *Discovery,* departed London.

December 24, 1814 - The Treaty of Ghent between America and Britain was signed, officially ending the War of 1812.

December 25, 1776 - During the <u>American Revolution</u>, George Washington took 2,400 men across the Delaware River and then attacked at Trenton, New Jersey.
