ASSOCIATION NEWS:

<u>Crime Prevention:</u> The Google Voice scam: How this verification code scam works and how to avoid it. Scammers target people who post things for sale on sites like Craigslist or Facebook Marketplace. They also prey on people who post looking for help finding their lost pet.

The scammers contact you and say they want to buy the item you're selling — or that they found your pet. But before they commit to buying your item, or returning your pet, they feign hesitation. They might say they've heard about fake online listings and want to verify that you're a real person. Or they might say they want to verify that you're the pet's true owner.

They send you a text message with a Google Voice verification code and ask you for that code. If you give them the verification code, they'll try to use it to create a Google Voice number linked to your phone number.

No matter what the story is, don't share your Google Voice verification code — or any verification code — with someone if you didn't contact them first. That's a scam, every time. Report it at ReportFraud.ftc.gov.

<u>Safety Patrol-</u> Heatstroke prevention: With June bringing the start of the summer months, we are getting closer to hot temperatures both inside and outdoors. One of the biggest consequences of working in heat includes heat stress and one of the biggest risks is heatstrokes. National Heatstroke Prevention Day is on May 1st, giving safety leaders the perfect opportunity to refresh everyone's minds on the signs, symptoms and risk factors of heatstroke.

What can you do to prevent heat exhaustion and heat stroke?

There are multiple things that you can do. To prevent heat exhaustion, you can:

- Modify work schedules to avoid the times where the sun is the hottest
- Add frequent breaks
- Provide a shaded break area
- Arrange protective clothing such as hats and lightweight clothes.
- Drink plenty of fluids-stay hydrated
- Avoid caffeine or alcohol which enhance dehydration
- Wear loose fitting clothes.

In the Garden:

- Plant warm weather crops such as: sweet potatoes, <u>peppers</u>, okra, tomatoes, and <u>eggplant</u>.
- Add <u>mulch</u> to your <u>broccoli</u>, <u>peas</u>, and other Cole crops to keep the soil cooler
- It's time to thin out your <u>orchard</u>. Make sure there are approximately six inches of space between each piece of fruit on your trees.
- Plant a second planting of beans, squash, corn, peppers, and tomatoes
- Mulch vegetables to keep the soil moist and cool.
- Plant herbs.
- Water your garden beds regularly and adequately.
- Check plants regularly for pests and diseases.
