ASSOCIATION NEWS:

<u>CAC (Citizens Advisory Committee) Meeting:</u> We had our last meeting of the CAC on 16 June. Turnout was pretty good. Guest speakers came in from Code Enforcement/Housing. The meeting are free and open to all. Next meeting will be September 15th. Located at: https://cyptca.com/ **New Business Tabled at Meeting:** We introduced a proposal to amend the constitution which was somewhat too lengthy to discuss in detail. We aren't planning to go away anytime soon but based upon some other relevant experiences we figured it was necessary to add this to the constitution. It is here printed for your review, to be voted upon at the August meeting:

- a. Resolution to Dissolve: To dissolve the Association the Board of Directors must present a resolution recommending that the Association be dissolved to the active membership in accordance with the provisions of Art 13 of the VA Non-stock Corp Act as amended. A proposal for dissolution, including a plan of distribution of assets may be considered at a meeting of the active membership for which notice has been given as required by the act. The resolution shall be adopted if approved at such meeting where a quorum exists by more than two-thirds of the votes cast.
- b. <u>Plan of Distribution</u>: The plan of distribution shall provide for transfer of the association's assets to one or more corporations, societies, or organizations engaged in (i) activities similar to those of the association or (ii) religious, charitable, community, or educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the IRS code
- c. <u>Disposal of Assets</u>: Upon approval of a resolution for dissolution this association shall cease to conduct its affairs, except insofar as it is is necessary for their proper completioin. The Board of Directors shall, after payment of all liabilities of the association, dispose of the assets of the Association in such a manner as the Board may determine in accordance with the approved Plan of Distribution.

Crime Prevention: Vishing

Fraudulent calls or voicemails fall under the category of "vishing." Scammers call potential victims, often using prerecorded robo-calls, pretending to be a legitimate company to solicit personal information from a victim.

Perhaps you get a call about your car's extended warranty. If you answer this call and get connected to an alleged agent, you may be asked to provide information such as:

- First and last name
- Address
- Driver's license number
- Social Security number
- Credit card information

Some scammers may also record your voice and ask a question you're likely to answer with "Yes." They can then use this recording to pretend to be you on the phone to authorize charges or access your financial accounts.

Safety Patrol- Electrical Hazards

- Do not run electrical cords under rugs
- Don't overload outlets
- Unplug all unused appliances
- Make sure appliances have adequate space for air circulation
- Clean exhaust fans
- Keep electrical appliances away from water sources
- Check to make sure electrical cords are in good condition
- Clean the dryer of lint after every use
- Clean the dryer vent and exhaust pipe annually
- Use power strips instead of extension cords
- Maintain appliances in accordance with manufacturer's instructions
- Have a professional electrician inspect your home every 10 years

In the Garden:

- Prune shrubs that bloom on old wood after done flowering
- Be on high alert for insect pests and diseases. These include but are not limited to aphids, asparagus beetles, cabbage worms, cutworms, tomato hornworms, scale, snails, <u>slugs</u>, leaf spot, mildew, and rust, Japanese beetles.
- Use mature compost or aged manure to side-dress plants.
- Prune wisteria after it finishes blooming.
- Place row covers or netting over bushes with ripening berries to keep the birds from eating them.
- Inspect trees for nests of bagworms.
- Stake tomatoes, if you haven't already
- Ensure that your automatic irrigation system working properly.
- Fertilize and deadhead your roses.
- Some perennials that bloom late in the growing season, such as <u>Joe-Pye weed</u>, can get so tall that they flop over. Either stake them or trim them back by half to keep them tidier.

Get FREE, Door-to-Door, On-Demand Public Transportation Around the Resort Area Starting June 17

Starting this Friday, residents and visitors can conveniently ride around the resort area in the comfort and luxury of the Freebee all-electric Tesla Model X vehicles, which will operate seven days a week, from 11 a.m. to 11 p.m. The pilot program service area is bounded by Atlantic Avenue in the east, Birdneck Road in the west, 42nd Street in the north, and General Booth Boulevard in the south.

The City of Virginia Beach Will Recognize Juneteenth on Monday, 6/20Most City offices and facilities will be closed.

Last year, City Council voted on a resolution to make Juneteenth (June 19) a permanent City Holiday. Juneteenth marks the day in 1865 that enslaved people in Galveston, Texas, the last of the former Confederate states to abolish slavery, heard that the Civil War had ended and learned that the Emancipation Proclamation had made them free nearly two years earlier. It is generally considered the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States.

In observance of Juneteenth, most City offices and facilities will be **CLOSED** Monday, June 20.
