**CPERT:** A new item brought up at the recent association meeting is CPERT which stands for Cypress Point Emergency Response Team. The first meeting of this team will be at 6:30 PM on 31 August (a Wednesday) at the club. The purpose of this team is to draft a contingency plan in the event of a significant natural disaster that leaves us all on our own for 72 hours or longer without emergency services, power, or the ability to get in or out of the development. We have a team of volunteers but if you are interested please show up and we'll be glad to include you.

## **Crime Prevention:** Employment Scams

Employment scams use enticing, and hard-to-detect, lures to target people who've been out of work. Some scammers take a slow approach with interviews and a legitimate-seeming operation. They then collect personal information from your employment forms, or tell you to buy equipment or training.

Other scams get right to the point and promise guaranteed or easy income—if you purchase their program. Sometimes, a fake employer sends a large paycheck and asks you to send the "extra" back—a play on the popular overpayment scam.

You may also see job opportunities that involve receiving money and sending funds to another account, or receiving and reshipping packages. These "money mule" and "reshipping mule" jobs are often part of an illegal operation, and you could be personally liable.


**August 18, 1920** - The 19th [Amendment](#) to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, granting women the right to vote.

## **Safety Patrol- School Zone Driving Safety Tips**

- Be on the lookout for school zone signals and ALWAYS obey the speed limits.
- When entering a school zone, be sure to slow down and obey all traffic laws.
- Always stop for school busses that are loading or unloading children.
- Watch out for school crossing guards and obey their signals.
- Be aware of and watch out for children near schools, bus stops, sidewalks, in the streets, in school parking lots, etc.
- Never pass other vehicles while driving in a school zone.
- Never change lanes while driving in a school zone.
- Never make U-Turns while driving in a school zone.
- Never text while driving in a school zone.
- Avoid using a cell phone, unless it is completely hands-free, while driving in a school zone.
- Unless licensed to do so, never use handicap or emergency vehicle lanes or spaces to drop off or pick up children at school.

### VB10: Learn About New City Council Voter Districts

Due to [recent changes](#) to our local election system, Virginia Beach will have 10 election districts beginning with the November 2022 election. From here, you can learn more about each of the 10 districts with a District Profile, which contain information such as how many households and individuals reside in a given district, average income, median home value, education statistics and school locations, economic data, and how the land of a district is zoned.

The data in the profiles will evolve along with the districts. Depending on needs identified by our residents and City Council, additional data points may be added and updated as new information becomes available. These profiles are meant to give residents in a district a comprehensive view to better understand the subtleties of their community and how they fit into our community at large.

## Monkeypox Update from the VBDPH

Monkeypox is an illness caused by the monkeypox virus. Common symptoms of monkeypox are fever, headache, muscle aches, swollen lymph nodes and a rash that can look like pimples or blisters and may be painful or itchy. The rash may be on the face, the inside of the mouth, hands, feet, chest, or genital area. Symptoms are usually mild or moderate and typically resolve within two to four weeks. Monkeypox is rarely fatal.

### **Is a vaccine available?**

There are two FDA-approved vaccines that can prevent monkeypox. The VBDPH is providing vaccination for persons in high-risk groups using the Jynneos vaccine. Persons in high-risk groups are advised to get vaccinated against monkeypox because there is a greater chance they could become infected. VBDPH is currently vaccinating individuals in these high-risk groups via direct outreach. The department is encouraging individuals who believe they are at high-risk to reach out by calling **757-518-2700**. So far, VBDPH has provided approximately 400 monkeypox vaccines for high-risk community members as a result of this targeted outreach and is continuing to work to expand vaccination opportunities in the city. Anyone who thinks they might be at risk can reach out to VBDPH to talk about whether they would be advised to schedule a vaccination.

## Election Officials Needed (A note from John Eason, A Precinct Chief):

The office of Virginia Beach Voter Registration and Elections has openings for individuals to serve as election officials (formerly called poll workers) in the upcoming November 8<sup>th</sup> election.

To be considered for a role as an election official, applicants must meet the following basic requirements:

- A U.S. citizen at least 18 years of age and a registered voter in the Commonwealth of Virginia
- Not hold an elected office or be an employee of an elected official
- Must be available to work the entire election day
- Must have a courteous, professional, and helpful attitude
- Must be able speak, read, and write English
- Must have patience.

Election officials are paid \$162 for working on election day, plus \$20 for attending a required three-hour training class conducted prior to election day.
