

In The Garden in February:

In February, as winter gradually gives way to warmer weather, gardeners have a crucial window of opportunity to prepare for spring. Here are some essential gardening tasks you won't want to skip:

- 1. Prune Fruit Trees: February is the ideal time to prune fruit trees. Since the trees are still dormant and leafless, shaping them and promoting stronger yields becomes easier. If you haven't pruned your fruit trees yet, now is the time to do so. Check with your local extension office for specific pruning guidelines based on your region and tree variety 1.
- 2. Start Indoor Seeds: Begin sowing seeds indoors for cool-season crops like cauliflower, celery, kohlrabi, kale, collards, mustard greens, and bok choy. These can be transplanted into the garden in March and April 2.
- Organize Equipment: Take stock of your gardening tools and equipment. Discard broken tools and cracked planters. Keeping your gear organized will
 make spring gardening more efficient.
- 4. Check Perennial Beds: Inspect perennial beds for frost heave. If you notice any plants lifted out of the soil due to freezing and thawing, gently press them back down. Applying mulch can also help protect roots if needed 3.
- Direct-Sow Cool-Season Crops: Consider direct-sowing cool-season crops such as leaf lettuce and spinach. These hardy greens thrive in cooler temperatures.
- Plant Perennial Vegetables: If you haven't already, plant perennial vegetables like rhubarb and asparagus. These long-lived plants will reward you with harvests year after year a.

Remember, the timing of these tasks may vary based on your growing zone and local weather conditions. So grab your gardening gloves and get ready for a flourishing spring season! 🍞 😩

History Corner:

February 1, 2003 - Sixteen minutes before it was scheduled to land, the Space
 Shuttle *Columbia* broke apart in flight over west Texas, killing all seven crew members
 February 2, 1848 - The war between the U.S. and Mexico ended with the signing of the <u>Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo</u>.

February 3, 1865 - A four-hour peace conference occurred between President Abraham Lincoln and Confederate Vice President <u>Alexander Stephens</u> at Hampton Roads, Virginia.

February 3, 1870 - The 15th <u>Amendment</u> to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, guaranteeing the right of citizens to vote, regardless of race, color, or previous condition of servitude.

February 8, 1910 - The Boy Scouts of America was founded by William Boyce in Washington, D.C., modeled after the British Boy Scouts.

February 9, 1943 - During <u>World War II in the Pacific</u>, U.S. troops captured Guadalcanal in the Solomon Islands after six months of battle, with 9,000 Japanese and 2,000 Americans killed **February 11, 1847**- American inventor <u>Thomas Edison</u> (1847-1931) was born in Milan, Ohio **February 12, 1809** - <u>Abraham Lincoln</u> (1809-1865) the 16th U.S. President was born in Hardin County, Kentucky

February 15, 1898 - In Havana, the U.S. <u>Battleship *Maine*</u> was blown up while at anchor and quickly <u>sank</u> with 260 crew members lost.

February 20, 1962 - Astronaut John Glenn became the first American launched into orbit.

February 21, 1972 - President <u>Richard Nixon</u> arrived in China for historic meetings with Chairman Mao Tse-tung and Premier Chou En-lai.

Birthday - George Washington (1732-1799) was born in Westmoreland County, Virginia.


February 23, 1991 - In Desert Storm, the Allied ground offensive began after a devastating monthlong air campaign targeting Iraqi troops in both Iraq and Kuwait.

February 27, 1991 - In Desert Storm, the 100-hour ground war ended as Allied troops entered Kuwait just four days after launching their offensive against Saddam Hussein's Iraqi forces. **February 27, 1950** - The 22nd <u>Amendment</u> to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, limiting the president to two terms or a maximum of ten years in office.



Virginia Beach Parks & Recreation to Host Job Fair on Feb. 28

Virginia Beach Parks & Recreation (VBPR) will host a job fair to find energetic, dedicated employees to fill hundreds of spring and summer part-time positions with pay starting at \$15 an hour.

The department brings on about 350-500 staff members annually to fill these seasonal positions that have the potential to extend into the fall. Positions with particularly high demand include childcare staff, groundskeeping and lifeguards.

Interested applicants are invited to participate in the Spring Job Fair from 4-7 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 28, at the Bow Creek Recreation Center, 3427 Club House Road. VBPR hiring managers and team members will be on-site to answer questions from interested applicants with more than 10 information tables.
