VIRGINIA BEACH, Va. – Virginia Beach Parks & Recreation (VBPR) is asking residents to complete a short online survey to learn more about the demographics and interests of local individuals with disabilities. The survey opens today, May 14, and will remain open until May 21. The data gathered will help guide future programming and services for the Therapeutic Recreation and Inclusion Services Unit.

VBPR currently offers a variety of <u>Therapeutic Recreation</u> programs and <u>Inclusion Services</u> to individuals with disabilities and diverse needs with a mission to:

- Enrich quality of life
- Meet community needs
- Enhance skill development, leisure education and recreation participation
- Increase independence through individualized goals and objectives

The information from the survey is needed to help ensure that these programs and services are targeted appropriately to serve the greatest number of participants and meet their needs. 2019 Personal Property Tax Drive-Thru Appeals Available Through June 11

VIRGINIA BEACH, Va. — May 7, 2019 — Commissioner of the Revenue Phil Kellam wants to remind taxpayers that personal property tax bills are due Wednesday, June 5. However, for the 21st consecutive year, Commissioner Kellam has set up a drive-thru appeals process to allow Virginia Beach residents to appeal their assessment. The drive-thru appeals process will run through Tuesday, June 11. If citizens have already paid their personal property bill, they may still appeal and will be refunded any monies should the assessment be lowered. The drive-thru is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Follow the signs to the Landstown Road entrance at the Princess Anne Athletic Complex, 4001 Dam Neck Rd, Virginia Beach, VA 23456.

Voter Registration and Absentee Voting Information for the June 11 Party Primary Elections

Democratic Party Primary: Virginia Senate 6th and 7th Districts; Republican Party Primary: Virginia Senate 7th District and City Treasurer | The deadline to register to Vote is May 20

Friday, May 10, 2019

Virginia Beach registered voters can cast their ballots on June 11. Party Primary Elections will be held for Virginia Senate and City Treasurer. The Democratic Party will have a Primary for Member Senate of Virginia 6th District and 7th District. The Republican Party will have a Primary for Member Senate of Virginia 7th District and for City Treasurer.

Since Virginia voters do not register by political party, any voter can vote whenever a primary is held. If both the Democratic and Republican Parties are holding primaries at a polling location on the same day, Virginia law allows the voter to vote in only one of the party primary elections. Voters must indicate whether they want to vote in the Democratic Party Primary or the Republican Party Primary.

To be eligible to vote on Tuesday, June 11, those not registered, or any registered voter who needs to make a change to their registration address or name, must submit a Voter Registration Application no later than close of business on Monday, May 20. Mailed Voter Registration Applications must also be post-marked on or before May 20.

Residents may register in-person at the Voter Registration & Elections office, all Virginia Beach Public Library locations, and Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles Offices (in conjunction with DMV transactions) during normal hours of operation. Online Voter Registration is also available on the Department of Elections website at www.elections.virginia.gov. In order to receive an **absentee ballot by mail**, Absentee Ballot Applications must be received in our office by 5 p.m. on Tuesday, June 4. The voted ballot must arrive in our office by 7 p.m. (Close of Polls) on Election Day, June 11. If you will be out of town or are unable to make it to the polls on June 11, we are open for **absentee voting in-person** from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, June 8 at:
