SCAM Alert: Many scammers work the same way. They:

1. **Pretend** to be from an agency or organization you know to gain your trust.
2. Claim there is a **problem** or prize.
3. **Pressure** you to act immediately.
4. Tell you to **pay** in a specific way.

Watch out for red flags Keep an eye out for these red flags, and remember that our employees will *never*:

- **Threaten** you with arrest or legal action because you don't agree to pay money immediately.
- **Suspend** your Social Security number or monthly payment.
- Claim to need **personal information or payment** to activate a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) or another benefit.
- **Pressure** you to take immediate action, including sharing personal information.
- Ask you to **pay with** gift cards, prepaid debit cards, wire transfers, cryptocurrency, or cash.
- **Threaten** to seize your bank account.
- Offer to **move your money** to a "protected" bank account.
- **Demand** secrecy.
- **Direct message** you on social media

AI-Powered Scams

Perhaps the most obvious example of scammers using new technology to power existing scams comes from artificial intelligence (AI). For example, scammers might use AI to:

Write more convincing and natural-sounding [phishing emails and text messages](#).

- Create deepfakes of celebrities to trick victims into thinking they're investing in a good company or project.
- Impersonate the victim's friend or relative and ask for money as part of a [grandparent scam](#).
- Impersonate an employer and ask for personal information.

The potential to create an image, video or voice of someone else could make existing scams even more believable, and opens up new opportunities for scammers.

In the Garden:

What to plant in November

1. You may still have time to plant garlic and shallots this month. You can plant these if the ground isn't frozen. Space the cloves 6 inches apart, and plant them pointy-end up!
2. There's still time to plant spring bulbs this month. It's best to get them in the ground before it freezes. If you wait too long, there's a good chance they won't make it to next spring.
3. Sow annual and perennial flower seeds that need a significant chill time. It's best to do this in containers, so you don't lose track of them.
4. Plant wildflower seeds after a killing frost. Scatter the seeds according to the package directions. Compress them into the soil, but don't bury them. Water the soil so that it's moist but not soaking wet.
5. Plant bare-root trees. Keep them moist and cool until you're able to plant them.
6. Dig the hole for your live Christmas tree now, before the ground freezes.

November garden maintenance chores

- Store hoses and sprinklers in a handy, frost-free location for winter watering.
- Unless you have a lot of snow covering your yard, make periodic checks for weeds. Keep an eye out for perennial weeds and continue to thwart their invasion plans.
- You'll also need to be vigilant about "winter annual" weeds that have sprouted already. These germinate in the fall and can survive the winter as small plants. Next spring they'll continue to grow and become a nuisance, so the sooner you can get rid of them, the better.

History Corner:

November 2, 1947 - The first and only flight of Howard Hughes' "Spruce Goose" flying boat occurred in Long Beach Harbor, California.

November 2, 1962 - During the Cuban Missile Crisis, President John F. Kennedy announced on TV, "the Soviet bases in Cuba are being dismantled,

November 6, 1860 - Abraham Lincoln was elected as the 16th U.S. President and the first Republican

November 8, 1942 - Operation Torch, the Allied landings in North Africa, began as 400,000 soldiers under the command of General Dwight D. Eisenhower landed at Morocco and Algeria.

November 9, 1989 - The Berlin Wall was opened up after standing for 28 years as a symbol of the Cold War. The 27.9 mile wall had been constructed in 1961.

November 10, 1775 - The U.S. Marine Corps was established as part of the U.S. Navy. It became a separate unit on July 11, 1789.

November 11, 1938 - Irving Berlin's *God Bless America* was first performed.

November 13, 1927 - The Holland Tunnel was opened to traffic. The tunnel runs under the Hudson River between New York City and Jersey City

November 15, 1777 - The Articles of Confederation were adopted by Continental Congress.

November 19, 1863 - President Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg Address during ceremonies dedicating 17 acres of the Gettysburg Battlefield as a National Cemetery.

November 19-20, 1990 - The Cold War came to an end during a summit in Paris as leaders of NATO and the Warsaw Pact signed a Treaty on Conventional Forces in Europe

November 22, 1718 - Blackbeard the pirate (Edward Teach) was killed off the coast of North Carolina after a long and prosperous career.

November 28, 1934 - FBI agents killed bank robber George "Baby Face" Nelson near Barrington, Illinois.

November 30, 1782 - A provisional peace treaty was signed between Great Britain and the United States heralding the end of America's War of Independence.
